75th Anniversary of Victory Tour

Day 1 – 29 April ... Depart Canada for Amsterdam.

Day 2 – 30 April ...We arrive in Amsterdam, meet our bus and then drive to the National Military Museum in Amersfoort. In the afternoon we will check into our hotel in Ede for the next eight nights: ReeHorst Hotel

Day 3 – 1 May ... We will hit the battlefields today when we look at the airborne operation at Arnhem. The unique logistic challenges of this operation and the logistics memorials will be on our tour, as well as the Airborne museum.

Day 4 – 2 May ... Today we will meet up with the Keep Them Rolling team in Nijmegen for the opening ceremonies marking the start of their Op Faust commemorative convoys. We will travel with them to Ede where a commemorative plaque will be unveiled on the site of the original food depot.

Day 5 – 3 May... We will look at Op Veritable, the assault on the Rhineland, which was the largest logistics operation of the war. We will end the day with a visit to Groesbeek Canadian War Cemetery.

Day 6 – 4 May ... This is Dutch Remembrance Day and we will attend the Canadian ceremony at Holten Canadian War Cemetery.

Op Faust was the ground portion of delivering food aid to thousands of starving Dutch civilians. A truce was negotiated between the Germans and Allies that allowed Canadian truckers to drive through the German lines. A unique event in logistics history that we will mark.

Day 7 – 5 May This is the big day for ceremonies: Liberation Day. We will join the crowds of people in Wageningen for the Canadian commemoration and parade. Some of our group may march in the parade.

Day 8 – 6 May ... We will look at the finish our battlefield touring by examining Op Blockbuster and the capture of the Hochwald. Our day will end with a visit to Xanten, site of a Roman fort and a Canadian battlefield.

Day 9 – 7 May ... A day of options: a day trip to Amsterdam, a tour of the Canadian airborne battlefields of Op Varsity, or a relaxing day in Ede.

Day 10 – 8 May ... We will depart the hotel early to get our flights back to Canada from Amsterdam airport. Anyone staying on in Europe can make easy connections from the airport.
